others won't feel insecure around you.*

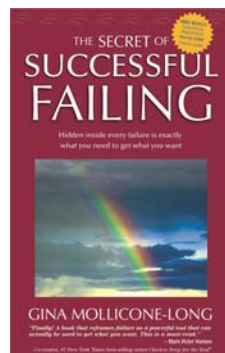
We were born to make manifest the glory that is within us.
